

WHAT'S IT LIKE TO BE A METHODIST?

When my wife was in college, she spent a summer working on a sheep and cattle farm in rural Southwest England. One day, the tenant farmer with whom she worked was telling her about a funeral she was going to attend. But she was a little apprehensive about it, as she explained to Susannah, "He was Methodist!" As if he had been in a cult or something. My wife smiled and told her that she too was a Methodist, and that it is a fairly common denomination in the US (and that Methodism actually originated in the UK). And then she said to my wife, "What's it like to be a Methodist?"

What's it like to be a Methodist? Truth be told, the term "Methodist" was originally used as a term of mockery. John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, his brother Charles, and a few of their friends came together during their years at Oxford University and formed a "Holy Club." This group committed to a life of prayer and service and reading of the Word, and they had rules to help order and guide their life together. Outsiders joked at the methodical way in which the group lived their lives, and so they mockingly called them "Methodists"—and the name stuck. And so did their rules. Many of you have heard of these "three simple rules." They hold us accountable, they encourage us, and they even challenge us. They're short and rather simple in language but not always simple to live out. They are: (1) Do no harm, (2) Do good, and (3) Attend upon all the ordinances of God—or as Bishop Ruben Job translated into 21st Century language, "Stay in love with God." In my opinion, the third rule is the most important. Because I believe the other two flow from our love of God!

For Wesley, "staying in love with God" meant engaging in the gifts of worship, Bible reading, prayer, communion, etc. These actions, according to Wesley, inspire a life of love and compassion. Now, I will be the first to admit, staying in love with God is sometimes easier said than done. When the storms of life rage, how do you stay in love with God? Perhaps one of the best ways that we can stay in love with God is to remember that our love for God comes from God first loving us. I love these words from 1 John 4: "Love is from God ... God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us ... we love because he first loved us." God first loving us is the basis of our faith and our relationship with Him. And the story of our faith is the story of God wooing us, loving us steadfastly, and welcoming us into His kingdom.

It is hard to fathom this love at times. It is especially hard when we see or experience the suffering and pain in humanity. Or when we acknowledge our



Prayer as Hymn, Hymn as Prayer

Prayers are an integral part of communal worship. The first prayers most children learn are the prayers said as Grace before a meal. Some, like God Is Great, are spoken; others, for example, the Wesley Blessing (Be Present at Our Table Lord), are meant to be sung. The tune for Be Present at Our Table Lord is the Doxology which is based on Psalm 100. A Psalm, a prayer, a song.

Hymns as prayers are appropriate from morning— When Morning Gilds the Sky, or We Thy People Praise Thee—till night—Day Is Dying in the West and Now on Land and Sea Descending.

Bedtime prayers can be sung. "Father we thank you for the night, and for the pleasant morning light. For rest and food and loving care, and all that makes the day so fair." This children's bedtime prayer written by Rebecca Weston in 1890 is still found in children's prayer books and sung by children around the world.

We go to God in both prayer and song. When we sing, we sing from the heart, knowing God hears and attends to prayers and voices raised to Him.

Daily, raise your voice in song and in prayer to God.
