- 4. What are the questions that help us understand what we must ask as we seek God's personal will in our own external circumstances? (p.81)
- 5. What is the one central conviction on which discernment is based? (p.82) Where have you felt God's active presence in your life this week? Can you share an example or journal about this?
- 6. What does Trevor Hudson say happens when we live without reflection in our life? (p. 83)
- 7. Describe the fullness of life we may experience when we reflect on our experiences of success and failure and listen to what God may be saying to us. (p. 83)
- 8. Pray the prayer in the Discernment Exercise on page 84. You may want to incorporate this into your daily devotional or prayer time with God.
- 9. Discuss or journal how we can reflect on our present circumstances in three areas of our outer landscape.
- 10. Discuss the 5 basic steps of the daily Examen and how you might incorporate this into your daily life. On your own practice the Examen. (See Discernment Exercise on p. 89)

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
